

 - upgrades/repairs to existing infrastructure
 - improved access to washrooms/changerooms
 - naturalization of the west headland and west beach
 - addressing boat storage, including for small watercraft
 - considering a shared building at the harbour

Stakeholder Meetings what we have heard (so far....)

- common ground on many topics including the need for (continued):
 - better east-west and north-south connectivity
 - better sharing of spaces and amenities by a variety of waterfront users

Stakeholder Meetings topics for further discussion/investigation

- topics for which limited common ground on potential directions has emerged to date
 - use of inner harbour/marina expansion
 - trailer park
 - Victoria Park
 - the role/function of waterfront parks/spaces beyond the core
